- Nonprofit organization
- No yearly hour requirements-However!
- Forms submitted to guidance-keep a copy!
- 3 week turnaround for hours to post or be returned
- Faxed copies are not accepted

### What is Dual Enrollment?

#### www.broward.edu/dual

The dual enrollment program with Broward College allows eligible students to attend college whilst concurrently enrolled in high school

- Grades 6-12
- Have a high school un-weighted cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher (at time of registration)
- Meet min. test score requirements through the ACT/SAT/PERT examinations

Math	24+	19+	114+
Reading	24+	19+	106+
ELA	25+	17+	103+

## PPCHS Schedule Change Policy

Schedule requests & accommodations will be made for the following reasons *ONLY*:

- Student has already received credit for the course.
- Student has not met the pre-requisite for the scheduled course.
- Student has an incomplete schedule.
- Student previously failed the course <u>with the same teacher</u>.
- Student needs specific course to meet graduation requirements

  (priority is given to seniors and students with non-elective graduation requirement issues).
- Administrative reasons (ex: class size reduction).
- Academic misplacement as identified by teacher and/or student performance (rare occasions).

  - Determines National Merit Scholars (junior year)
  - \$16
- Juniors are encouraged to take the SAT/ACT in the Spring, if not sooner
- Free/reduced lunch students may be eligible for fee waiver (See Mrs. Moses for details)
  - SAT: \$52.50 (w/ optional essay)
  - ACT: \$38.00 (ACT Only); \$54.50 (ACT + Writing)
